- September 4 & 5 we had our Grade Level assemblies which reviewed the rules, student code of conduct, policies and procedures so that all staff and students are safe and can meet their full potential.

- We had 1 successful Practice Fire Drill and still need to have two more fire drills as well as a practice lockdown drill before end of January.
- > Today, September 17st was our Opening School Mass held at Our Lady of the Scapular Church.

- Next Thursday September 26th is our Grade 9 Curriculum Night. Parents will have an opportunity to walk in the footsteps of their child's steps as they visit with their classroom teachers. Teachers will provide a brief but descriptive outline of the Grade 9 program specific to the subject.

- Pilgrimage supporting our brothers and sisters in Haiti. Our Pilgrimage will take place on Wednesday October 23rd. During Period 4 there will be a Pilgrimage Mass followed by the Pilgrimage walk after school. Students will receive community service hours for raising funds and walking. We will finalize plans and rolls it out to the students through our Pilgrimage committee during the first couple weeks in October.

- > There are many unique components to curriculum delivery at Saint Paul:
 - To begin our French Immersion Program in now available to Gr. 9, 10 & 11 students.
 - Also, the Advanced Placement (AP Prep) program is in our Gr. 9 classes in English, Geography, Mathematics and Science. Grade 10 classes in English, History, Mathematics and Science, Gr. 11 English, Math & Science.
- It is nice to see all the students in full swing of getting involved and immersed in school and extra-curricular life. Each and every day we are communicating tryouts on our morning announcements, social media account and TV screens. We strongly encourage all students to get involved. There is surely something for everyone to participate in ⁽²⁾

C. OPEN DISCUSSION –

QUESTION PERIOD:

Christine Q: Christine indicated that she loves the posts on Facebook. She wondered if students are on Facebook. Is this the intended audience of post?

Kelly A: Anything posted to Facebook is auto-posted across a multitude of social media sites including Instagram and X (formerly Twitter). There is no one answer to the best way to reach students and parents so a multi-targeted approach seems best. Morning announcements over the PA system and then

rebroadcast on Television screens around the school is another way that Saint Paul is ensuring that students get the necessary information. Mr. Mauri and Mr. Tropea are the moderators of the social media component.

Robin: Students are also involved in the tech component.

Melissa R: Saint Paul Arts also has their own social media presence

Kelly: Anything posted on Saint Paul Arts site is cross-posted automatically to all of our social media identities.

Monica Q: Discussing the experience of her own children in highly competitive STEM programs at post secondary (Calculus, Physics, Biology and Chemistry). Monica mentioned that IPAD annotations using "Goodnotes" is almost exclusively the practice. Monica questioned if we can incorporate these technological devices and apps in the senior academic program at the least to prepare students for post secondary.

Kelly A: Thank you for the feedback. This is an important discussion and Kelly felt that it is necessary to pass along to program chairs for discussion at subject council to best serve the individual programs that would each have their own needs.

Linda Q: Wondered how we are fostering a move away from cell phones given the current ministry ban for students but reliance on social media etc.

Kelly A: The social media ban has been a change for all people involved in education including both staff and students. The staff are ensuring that when there are sign up lists, QR codes but also pen an paper options are available. The current cellphone ban is a non-negotiable from the ministry and Kelly made the analogy to the non-negotiable masks from Covid.

Lindsay: as someone in the trenches, she reported that the students are responding well.

Alex: reports that for some students and classrooms there has been little change as teachers had always collected phones

Jen P: suggested that it is not about eradication but responsible use

Kelly: Some Northern boards are using a Bell-to-Bell method where students don't even have their phones at lunch. Agreed that Saint Paul students have been very respectful.

Frank Q: What did the August memo about extended vacations mean?

Kelly A: The school board has seen an increase in extended vacations or absences from school for students. It is impossible to ignore that extended absences do get in the way of education. Prior knowledge is helpful to students and staff. There are forms in the main office that should be completed for any extended absences. Kelly also offered a reminder that an absence from a class for more than fifteen days straight would result in removal from the class according to ministry policy unless a child is on a learning plan during that time.
