Parent-Teacher Interviews can be booked online and currently there are ?? appointments. Parent-Teacher Interviews allow you individual one-on-one time with your child's teacher to discuss your child's strengths, needs and overall progress in their classes. This interview experience is a valuable communication tool allowing you to be updated and also gives you the opportunity to discuss next steps to ensure your child is meeting their full potential.

We will be having a mental health and wellness fair on May 6th – various local community services will be onsite and offering information and small presentations for our students.

On May 6th, Niagara Catholic will hold its "Celebrating Excellence" Awards at Central Community Centre in NOTL. This year's student recipient of the Saint Paul Catch the Spirit Award is graduating student Lorenzo Lopez. Throughout his years at STP, Lorenzo has been an active member of Chaplain's Crew, attends weekly mass at Our Lady of the Scapular Church, holds a high academic standing and embodies the true heart of a Patriot daily with his teachers and peers. 

Our Graduation retreat will be at Heartland Forest on April 29th -- the Grads will be participating in many interactive activities. Prom is scheduled on June 12 at Americana and our Grad Mass and Luncheon will be held on June 10th at John Michaels.

C. OPEN DISCUSSION -

A general discussion about parking and traffic flow around the school after Shelby brought up parking and safety concerns. Alex suggested a traffic survey is possibly necessary as the direction of flow might seem backwards. Jenn indicated that there should only be one way in and one way out. Melissa asked if we tried to get a traffic light in the area some previously deemed necessary. Kelly indicated that when she contacted the city, the road was in fact under Regional jurisdiction. Kelly indicated that she is currently in talks with NSTS to re-evaluate the bus parking and arrival procedure as there are no set spots for buses. Alex indicated that there may be a board person who is in charge of traffic flow and Kelly reviewed the capital project requests which included the re-roofing of the school this summer, the repainting of the gym and floor improvements, the theatre upgrading and a repaving of the "kiss and ride" area which may help with traffic flow. Finally,

Melissa suggested that visitor spots are often full and asked if Kelly could remind supply teachers etc. that the intention of the visitor spots are for quick delivery, visits and should be kept free generally for that purpose. Kelly agreed that she would discuss with the office staff that have a larger interaction with supply teachers and other visiting education staff.

An additional open/general discussion took place following Kelly's tour of the new Indigenous Mural installed in the Library. The general consensus was one of appreciation for the art work. The following is the plaque that will accompany the mural:
